Salary is commensurate with teaching experience and is based on University of California salary scales.

Please submit a CV, student evaluations of the instructor, a teaching statement, and names of two references. In the teaching statement, please describe teaching strategies you currently use or plan to use to foster a diverse and inclusive learning experience, and to enable all students to excel and fully participate in the learning process. Applicants may be asked at a later date to submit an unedited video of recent teaching with a lesson plan.
